### **FROM THE HISTORIAN'S CORNER**

Another Irish Arts week (East Durham-Ulster County) has passed. Paul Keating and his crew have done it again- a fantastic week of Irish Music, dance language and Irish arts keeping everyone busy. The hardest part of the week was deciding on what class to take or what session to attend. Every night, Irish music and dancing feet blasted out of every pub along the route 145 strip. Of course, the festivities went deep into the morning and a lot of coffee was drank the next day.

A contingent of eleven musicians made the trek from Chicago. A newly formed group called the Chicago Reel was part of the group. They blew the audience away with their tight playing. Bounce and snap are two words I would use to describe their playing. I was quite proud of Chicago Reel, being that my cousins the Carey's are in the group. The vocalist from the band is Dennis O Sullivan, a 3 time All Ireland winner. He sang a song, I never heard sung before though I'm familiar with the story. The song is Ballyseedy Cross.

The story of Ballyseedy is one of the darkest most outrageous episodes in Irish History. After the rebellion and war for independence, the IRA split into Pro-Treaty and Anti-Treaty forces. Both sides were Irish – Brother against Brother. It was a brutal bloody civil war. Late at night March 6, 1923 nine Anti -Treaty prisoners were taken out of prison in Kerry and taken to Ballyseedy Cross. Free State soldiers tied them together and detonated a bomb. Stephen Fuller, one of the nine, was blown away across the road into the river. Miraculously, he survived and evaded capture. He lived to tell the story. After the initial bomb – some of the prisoners were still alive. The soldiers threw grenades and shot those still living. The eight that died were:

James Walsh

Pork Tenderloin with Kentucky Bourbon-Q Sauce

**Ingredients**

- 1/3 cup Kentucky bourbon
- 1/3 cup water
- 1 tablespoon white wine vinegar
- 1 tablespoon minced fresh ginger
- 1 jalapeno pepper, chopped
- 1 teaspoon minced garlic
- 1 1/2 pounds pork tenderloin
- 1/4 cup sorghum molasses
- 1/4 ketchup
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
- 1 teaspoon extra-virgin olive oil

**Preparation**

Combine the bourbon, water, vinegar, ginger, jalapeno and garlic in a bowl. Add the pork tenderloin and turn it to coat. Marinate the pork at room

temperature for 1 hour, turning every 15 minutes.

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Remove the pork from the marinade and pour the marinade into a small saucepan. Boil it over high heat until it is reduced by one-third. Add the sorghum and ketchup and cook until thickened for about 20 minutes. Season with kosher salt and pepper.

Brush the pork with the olive oil and sprinkle it with salt and pepper. Grill it over medium heat until the outside of the meat is well marked. Transfer the pork to a pan and place it in the oven at 350 degrees until it reaches an internal temperature of 155 degrees, about 30 minutes. Remove the pork from the oven and allow it to stand at room temperature for 5 minutes. Then slice it against the grain and serve it with the sauce made from the marinade.
