In addition to the above, she plays violin and has been chosen to perform in the All County Orchestra numerous times as well.

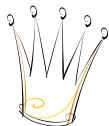
She is honored and thrilled to be chosen as the Irish Princess and, according to her Father, has begun assuming the role of "Princess" around the house already!

FROM THE
HISTORIAN'S CORNER

On a recent book buying expedition to my favorite bookstore (Roger's Book Barn – Craryville N.Y.), I discovered a couple of gems just sitting there calling my name! Upstairs, in the Irish section, second shelf, right in the middle, those babies were calling out: "take me home, take me home": of course, I couldn't resist. I had to give them a permanent home. They are now safely tucked away among their own kind in my Irish

book library. They seem to be happy. I know they'll flourish there.

A little bit about them.

Book I "The Patient Hand Holds Victory" by Kevin Patrick O'Sullivan.

Mr. O'Sullivan was a T.V. executive and philanthropist who founded the O' Sullivan Children's Foundation. He tells the story of his father, an Irish patriot who fought in the war of Irish Independence of 1918 in County Kerry. In 1920 he left Ireland on board an English ship destined for the U.S.A. He took a bunch of Irish Tricolor flags (banned at the time) with him. The ship had a Union Jack hoisted. He told the captain he found the "Jack" offensive and wanted to fly the Tricolor. The captain refused. In the middle of the night, he along with other Irishmen climbed up the mast and exchanged "the Jack" for the Tricolor.

In the morning the captain was not amused. He tore down the Irish flag and put back up the Union Jack. This was repeated nightly until the captain lost patience and had his father locked and chained in the hold of the ship until they got to N.Y. and Ellis Island! It reminds me of a song written by Bobby Sands IRA Hunger Striker: "I Wish I Was Back Home In Derry" in which the Fenian Prisoner shouts out "it's a Rebel I'm born and a rebel I'll die". Mr. O'Sullivan was a fier rebel (true rebel), an unrepentant Fenian to the end, I love that story.

Book II "Voyage Of The Hougomont and Life at

Fremantle" by Thomas McCarthy Fennell

This is a compelling and riveting account of Thomas Fennell, the Fenian leader of the Kilbaha (Clare) rebellion of 1867. He was soon arrested and transported to Australia along with 62 other Fenians on the last English prison ship going to that penal colony. This was a 3 month, tortuous journey. The English authorities despised these Fenian Patriots. In 1871, he was released and made his way to America. He finally settled in Elmira N.Y. He wrote his account, but it was never published until recently.

It's an indictment of the English legal/penal system of that time and a story of survival under horrific circumstances. Fennell stayed true to the "Fenian Faith" and helped John Devoy (Fenian Mastermind) devise a plan to rescue other Fenians in Australia's western penal colony. This story is further told in "The Story of the Catalpa". The Catalpa was the ship that was sent from New Bedford, Mass to rescue the prisoners. Fennell died in 1914, two years before the 1916 Easter Uprising. His family thrived in Elmira- one son became a lawyer, the other a Dentist.

It's a sad and amazing that 150 years after the Fenian Uprising we still have an ugly situation in the occupied 6 counties of Northeast Ireland. People are still being targeted, imprisoned, held, and harassed by a foreign government. Please go to the internet and read about three of them.

RECIPES

Bourbon Chili

This is not your mama's chili. Chef Love's recipe is real chili con carne, and it delivers with a complex spicy punch from the variety of dried chilies used. The

masa harina is a fantastic way to thicken the chili and enhance the flavor at the same time.

Prep Time: 15 minutes

Cook Time: 4 hours

Level: Intermediate

Serves 4-6

Ingredients:

- 1 cup Maker's Mark® Bourbon
- 2 pieces dried Ancho chilies
- 1 piece dried Pasilla chile
- 2 pieces dried Guajillo chilies
- 2 pieces dried Chipotle chilies
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 2 pounds boneless beef short ribs
- 3 cups onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon Mexican oregano
- 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1/4 cup dark brown sugar
- 1/4 cup apple cider vinegar
- 1/2 cup masa harina, if desired
- Salt and black pepper

- Additional Maker's Mark® Bourbon, if desired

Preparation:

Toast the chilies in a large, dry skillet over medium-low heat until lightly charred and fragrant, about 10 minutes. Transfer to a bowl.

- Bring 4 cups of water to a boil and pour over the chilies. Weight the chilies down in the water and

submerge with a paper towel. Allow the chilies to soften for about 20 minutes in the hot water. Drain the chilies once they are soft, reserving the soaking liquid. If you prefer your chili to be spicy, remove only the stem of the chilies, leaving the seeds intact. If you prefer a milder chili, take the time to open up the softened chili peppers and remove the seeds before adding the peppers to the blender.

- Add the softened chili peppers to the blender with 1 cup of Maker's Mark®. Puree until smooth.
- Heat a large skillet or Dutch oven over high heat. Pat the short ribs dry with a paper towel and season them generously with salt and black pepper. Add the tablespoon of oil to the hot pan. Reduce the heat to medium high. Sear the short ribs on all sides until well browned, about 3-4 minutes per side. Remove the short ribs to a plate and pour off the browning liquid and fat into a small bowl. Return the pan to the heat.
- Add the chopped onion and minced garlic to the skillet and cook until softened, about 10 minutes, stirring often.
- Add the cumin, oregano, thyme, brown sugar, vinegar, browning liquid, chili water and chili puree to the pot. Season with a

heavy pinch of salt.

Cover with a tight-fitting lid and simmer over low heat until the meat is very tender, about 3 hours, turning the ribs every 30 minutes and adding water as necessary if the braise becomes too dry.

- Once the short ribs can break apart with a spoon, remove the ribs from the stew and break the short ribs apart into small chunks using two spoons or forks.
- The chili braise in the pot should be the consistency of a thick soup. Reduce over low heat if necessary or add more water to reach desired consistency. Skim any excess fat and oil from the surface of the chili and discard. Stir the pieces of short rib back into the chili braise. Add an extra splash of Maker's Mark® if you want.
- Thicken the stew with masa harina (fine cornmeal makes a great substitute) if you desire: Ladle 2 cups of chili into a bowl and stir in the masa harina. Return the mixture to the pot and stir in with the rest of the chili. Simmer for 15 minutes. Serve the chili hot garnished with chopped scallions, cilantro and/or sour cream.
